Joint Effort to Request Funding

Mayor Joni Reich joined with the Mayors of Rehoboth Beach, Lewes, and Dewey Beach to send a letter to our U.S. Senators and Congressional Representative to request Federal funding to dredge the entire length of the Lewes-Rehoboth Canal. The Canal is managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and funding to dredge must be approved by Congress. The Canal was last dredged nearly 20 years ago in 2002. From the Town Manager

- We are awaiting bids for the Marina dredging that will take place this Fall.
- Fall planting is completed at the entrances, Town Hall and the island on and Dodds Lane by the Art League.
- A new roof has been installed on the Marina building.
- State Senator Ernie Lopez has earmarked a \$40,000 grant for drainage and street improvements for the Acres.
- The Town received \$38,871 in funds under the American Rescue Plan Act this year and will receive an equal amount in 2022. These funds will applied towards upgrades to our water plant.
- -The Town received \$17,183 in State Municipal Street Aid to assist in the maintenance of our roadways.

Block W Clean Up
