Two leases have been granted, with additional leases in the works. Speakers from the Center of Inland Bays, US Wind, and a group opposed to windfarms will present all sides of the issue.

Taking Care of Your Trees

As a service to residents, Jay Ashby of Cypress Tree Care will provide owners with a **tree assessment** paid for by the Town. Jay will inspect your trees and provide you with a written evaluation with suggested maintenance. To request this free Town service, contact Kayla Adkins in Town Hall. Owners do not need to be home and may hire any firm for follow-up care.

One item to pay attention to is **English Ivy and other vines growing on trees**, as they can weaken and harm trees. Vine roots should be cut at the base and at chest height to stop further growth,

Building Permit Pointers

A "Short Form" Building Permit is required for:

- Repairs to or replacement of architectural elements and major systems, such as new roof, siding, windows, doors, shutters, HVAC system, water heater, or encapsulation;
- Interior work greater than \$1,000 or involving electrical or plumbing;
- Installation of new driveway, hardscape walkway or patio, or irrigation system (requires DNREC-approved well).

Permits are **not** required for:

- Landscaping (trees and bushes);
- Interior appliances (refrigerator, stove, washer/dryer);
- Minor repairs that are "usual and necessary"; and
- Painting (though exterior colors must be approved).

Permit applications are on the Town website. A 2.25% fee is charged, and contractors must have a 2024 Business License from the Town. Contact **Bob Ribinsky**, **Zoning Officer**, with any questions and further help.

Helpful Reminders

Rear Exit Road: The gravel road is open from 6 am to 6 pm daily and locked by Security at other times for safety.

<u>Cul de Sac Parking:</u> A Resident or Renter Parking Tag is required to avoid being ticketed by Security. Contact Town Hall for further information.

Mosquito Spraying: The Town sprays for mosquitos every Friday from 6 am to 8 am to alleviate mosquitos during the Summer months.
