17	WHEREAS, the 2014 Henlopen Acres Comprehensive Development Plan further
18	provides "The Plan recommends instituting a standard of minimum trees per lot, in
19	particular on the 20 foot right of way owned by the Town."
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21	WHEREAS, the draft 2025 Henlopen Acres Comprehensive Development Plan
22	provides "This, along with a tree canopy of 74.9%, as measured by the State Department of
23	Agriculture in 2014, provides a very special environment to be preserved."
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25	WHEREAS, the draft 2025 Henlopen Acres Comprehensive Development Plan
26	further provides:
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28 29	This Plan recommends that these various efforts be continued and the minimum tree planting density requirement for new homes be
29 30	increased to require a higher percentage of deciduous canopy trees.
31	During the planning process, members of the Tree Committee
32	provided comments on a range of provisions to protect trees on
33	private property, including enforcing a minimum tree density on all
34	lots and requiring residents to obtain a Town permit to remove any
35	tree from their property. The Tree Committee also highlighted that
36	the Town currently has the densest tree canopy in Sussex County and
37	is listed as one of the top 5 in the State. The Committee suggested
38	that maintaining these standings be an aspirational goal for the Town
39	and as such, that is what this Plan recommends. To accomplish this,
40	this Plan recommends that current Code provisions be effectively
41	implemented and enforced to sustain the Town's canopy, and that
42	further measures focusing on retaining mature trees throughout the
43	Town be considered by the Board of Commissioners, especially those partaining to now home construction. Over the last 12 years, nearly

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**Section 2.** The Town Manager, for good cause shown, may authorize a canopy tree in the protected setback areas to be severely cut back, topped, or removed.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance is subject to the pending ordinance doctrine. Upon its introduction at the April 11, 2025 public meeting of the Mayor and Commissioners, no person shall remove a canopy tree in a manner prohibited by this Moratorium Ordinance

**Section 6.** If any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed or held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason whatsoever, then such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance which may be given effect without such invalid or unenforceable provision, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

**Section 7.** The Town Manager is hereby directed to: (1) publish the title and synopsis of this Moratorium Ordinance in the Cape Gazette and Coastal Point; and (2) post the same at Town Hall and on the Town's website.

**Section 8.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Henlopen Acres.
